Materiality and Relevant Topics

Identifying material issues is crucial for managing ESG risks and opportunities. We recognize the importance of ESG issues for our operations and our clients, carriers, and investors. As part of our first ESG report, we undertook a comprehensive materiality analysis to identify and prioritize key issues.

We considered sector-level materiality to identify all issues relevant to companies that operate in the associated sectors. We identified these themes using standards from the Sustainability Accounting Standards Board, a review of investor trends, and an analysis of peer organizations.

Our Environmental Impact

Operational Greenhouse Gas Emissions

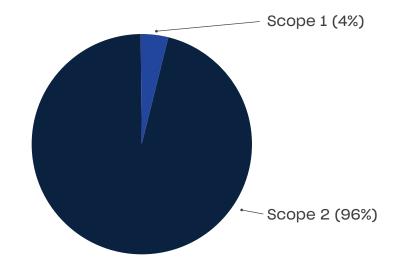
Echo identifies GHG emissions using the Greenhouse Gas Protocol three-scope system, developed by the World Resources Institute and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development. This year, Echo began calculating refrigerant emissions to more fully report on our environmental impact.

- **Scope 1** Direct emissions from sources that Echo owns or controls.
- **Scope 2** Indirect emissions related to the generation of purchased electricity, heating, and cooling.
- **Scope 3** Other indirect emissions related to company activities.

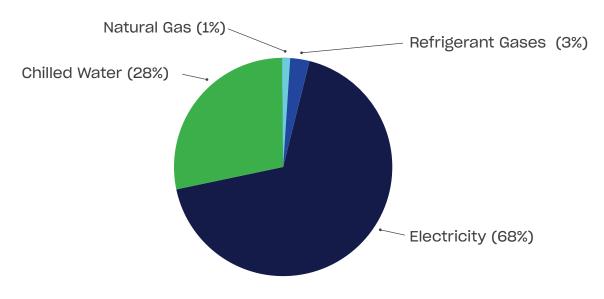

In performing its GHG Emissions analysis, Echo relied on actual data and, when reliable data wasn't available, emissions were estimated from occupied square footage of its facilities.

SmartWay

ISO 14001:2015

Echo's Chicago-based headquarters is certified to the ISO 14001:2015 standards and maintains an integrated quality system. Through the ISO program framework, we've decreased office waste, reduced the use of single-use cups, and enhanced our recycling programs. Our headquarters also improved ventilation by switching to electric heating instead of natural gas.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's SmartWay® Partnership

Echo ranked No. 1 in multiple categories of the SmartWay Carrier Performance Rankings, including grams of CO_2 per mile. SmartWay evaluates carrier emissions based on many factors, such as vehicle make, model and year, miles driven, load weight, empty miles, and idle time. For non-certified carriers, SmartWay assigns estimated emissions. Based on this data, Echo can quantify avoided emissions when selecting SmartWay -certified carriers. As a broker, Echo is scored on a 1-10 scale against peers for its use of SmartWay carriers. In the most recent rankings, Echo earned the top score of 1 in three out of six categories and a 3 in all other categories – placing it among the highest-performing SmartWay-certified brokers in the country.



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Use of SmartWay-Certified Carriers

Echo's commitment to using SmartWay-certified carriers has prevented approximately 38,270 metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions from polluting the environment.



Echo continues to participate in EcoVadis' sustainability assessment. EcoVadis is a global leader in business sustainability ratings, covering Ethics, Environment, Labor & Human Rights, and Sustainable Procurement. For the second year in a row, Echo improved its overall EcoVadis score – this time by nine points. As a result, Echo earned the EcoVadis "Committed Badge," recognizing its continued progress in sustainability.



Awards and Recognition

In addition to being named one of Newsweek's Greenest Companies, Echo was also named an Inbound Logistics 2024 Green Supply Chain Partner, marking the eighth year Echo has been recognized for this award. Companies that have achieved this award have been proven to actively go above and beyond to prioritize green initiatives and help the global supply chain become more sustainable. PepsiCo named Echo its 2024 Most Improved Sustainable 3PL at the annual sustainability summit, recognizing the company's improved SmartWay scores.





Training

All new hires in customer and carrier representative roles participate in at least seven weeks of best-in-class training, followed by three to five months of continuing education and mentorship. All new operations hires receive four weeks of intensive training, followed by two to three months of continuing education.

Mentoring Program

Echo matches employees with senior leaders to establish mentor/mentee relationships. We encourage participants to meet monthly with their mentors to ask questions, discuss career growth, and learn from senior leaders.

Emerging Leaders

This yearlong program includes workshops and engagement activities that help improve leadership skills. Participants meet monthly for interactive workshops and access to exclusive, tailored content.

Culture of Inclusion and Belonging

We propel our business forward by creating an environment where everyone can thrive. At Echo, we're committed to embracing diverse perspectives – from our colleagues and clients to our partners and communities – as we work toward a future rooted in empathy, fairness, and inclusion.

Echo's Business Resource Groups Continued Community Engagement in 2024

Echo Families

Collected supplies for <u>Chicago HOPES for Kids</u>, which supports children experiencing homelessness, and <u>Frieda's Place</u>, a local soup kitchen. The Families BRG also hosted Echo's annual Family Day, where volunteers created blankets, board books, and puzzle books for patients at Lurie Children's Hospital.

Echo Military

Partnered with <u>K9s for Veterans</u>, covering a year of food and medical costs for a veteran's service dog. The group also hosted a volunteer event where Echo employees assembled goodie bags for veterans and their service dogs, which were distributed in honor of Veterans Day.

Echo Multicultural

Donated to St. Matthew United Methodist Church to help feed children during the summer. The group also sponsored Edgewater Castle FC.

Women at Echo

Partnered with <u>Women in Trucking</u> and hosted a volunteer event to assemble hygiene kits for women experiencing homelessness. The group also held a clothing drive at the Phoenix branch, hosted a charity bingo night in Kansas City, Mo., and donated holiday gifts to a family in need in Detroit.

Echo Pride

Sponsored a fundraiser for Brave Space Alliance, which provides resources for LGBTQ+ individuals. The group also partnered with the organization to host, "Allyship and You," a workshop that helped Echo employees strengthen their understanding and support of the LGBTQ+ community.

ESG Committee

Echo's ESG Committee is comprised of a cross-functional team and is led by our Chief Financial Officer. This committee is continuously reviewing opportunities for improved reporting and new ways to reflect the company's commitment to environmental, social, and governance issues.

Artificial Intelligence

Echo's artificial intelligence use is guided by our Al Governance Committee, which is made up of senior leaders across the organization. We use Al to manage large datasets, enhance workflows, and assist our employees.

Supplier Code of Conduct

This year, Echo introduced its first-ever Supplier Code of Conduct, outlining the principles and standards we expect from our business partners. The code provides clear guidance on key areas, including human rights, ethical conduct, environmental responsibility, and data protection.

Cybersecurity and Data Privacy

Cybersecurity and data privacy are vital to Echo, our employees, clients, and carriers. Our cybersecurity teams report directly to the Chief Information Officer and manage the day-to-day security of Echo's network, data, endpoints, and applications. Data privacy is a shared responsibility between our IT and Legal departments.

Echo's robust security policy covers acceptable use, access control, antivirus protection, disaster recovery, incident response, security management, firewall/network security, passwords, physical security, risk assessment, auditing, and employee security training. All employees receive training at onboarding and annually thereafter.

Our Cybersecurity Risk Management program aligns with the U.S. National Institute of Standards and Technology's framework, and we regularly test and refine our protocols to stay ahead of emerging threats.
